Counterterrorism - Terrorist Screening Center History

The Terrorist Screening Center (TSC) was established by Homeland Security Presidential Directive 6 on September 16, 2003, which directed that a center be established to consolidate the government's approach to terrorism screening and to provide for the appropriate and lawful use of terrorist information in screening processes. As a result, the Attorney General, the Director of Central Intelligence, and the Secretaries of the Departments of State and Homeland Security signed a Memorandum of Understanding creating the TSC and placed it within the Federal Bureau of Investigation, U.S. Department of Justice. The TSC began operations on December 1, 2003. The Secretaries of the Departments of Treasury and Defense signed an addendum to the memorandum to join the partnership supporting the TSC in August 2004.
